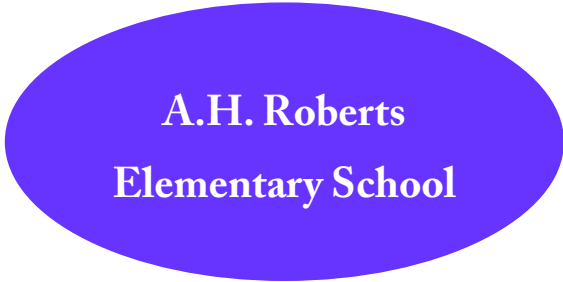

# 21<sup>st</sup> Century Community

## Learning Centers



This program supports the creation of community learning centers that provide academic enrichment opportunities during non-school hours for children who attend high poverty or low performing schools. The program helps students meet state and local student standards in core academic subjects, such as reading and math; offer students a broad array of Enrichment activities that can complement their regular academic programs; and offers literacy and other educational services to the families of participating children.



The 21<sup>st</sup> Century Community Learning Center is sponsored by Overton County Schools and funded through a grant through the US Department of Education and distributed through the State Department of Education.

## Who

This program is designed for students in grades Kindergarten through four who are at-risk of not meeting state standards on present or future state TCAP assessment.



## What

The 21<sup>st</sup> Century Community Center program will be supervised by a county wide coordinator, a site coordinator, assistant coordinator, teachers, and educational assistants. The program will use a multi-activity based format including: tutoring, basic skills reinforcement, individualized and group instruction, etc....to provide:

- \* Academic Assistance
- \* Transitional Support
- \* Life Skills
- \* Enrichment Opportunities
- \* Technology Awareness
- \* Accelerated Reader Instruction

The program will be held at A.H. Roberts Elementary School.

## When

Monday through Friday 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 a.m.

Monday through Friday 2:45 p.m. to 4:45 p.m.

Beginning Monday, August 24, 2009

- \* Daily morning sessions will be focusing on basic skills reinforcement.
- \* Daily afternoons, Monday through Thursday will be devoted to academics and Fridays will be recreation and enrichment day for 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Grades
- \* K, 1<sup>st</sup>, and 2<sup>nd</sup> will have Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday as academic days with Thursday as recreation and enrichment day.



## Registration

- \*If you would like for your child to participate in this program, return this completed brochure to the school office by Tuesday, August 18. More information will be sent home when this form is returned to school.
- \*If you do not wish for your child to be enrolled in this program please check the I decline section, sign the form, and return it to your child's teacher.

\*Enrollment acceptance is based on at-risk status and academic needs: from teacher referral, TCAP test results, STAR assessment, ThinkLink assessment, DIBELS, and academic performance.

- \* A waiting list of those students not qualifying for the program at the initial sign-up will be compiled and if space becomes available you will be contacted
