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Why Stay After School?

Research shows that children who attend Twenty-First Century after school programs more than half the time (more than 90 days a year) improve math grades by up to 49% and reading grades by up to 43%. Children in after school programs also improve stan-



dardized state test scores! Regular attendance has also been shown to improve classroom participation, behavior, school attendance and social skills.

After school care helps parents! Overton County parents continue to say that homework help is a very high priority for them. Students who stay for after school programs receive regular help to complete homework.

Fun and enrichment! Students in our after school program are moving and learning. Every day children get to play, exercise and learn new things from professionals and Community Partners.

After School Bus

Bus transportation is available for children whose parents cannot pick them up by 5:00 PM. The bus will run a route to several neighborhood drop off points. Parents must register children to ride the bus and designate an approved adult to sign the child off the bus. Children will generally be dropped off between 5:00 PM and 6:30 PM.

After School Activities

After homework is done, the fun begins! After school activities include a wide variety of educational, engaging activities. Some of them are:

- Academic enrichment—After school teachers stay in contact with students' regular school day teachers. If a student is falling behind or having academic problems, special help is available to address weak areas. Academic activities are research-based and are different from regular school day lessons.
